

Faithful People of Saint Thomas More,

This is First Communion Weekend here at STM! These occasions are helpful reminders to all of us that the sacramental life of the Church is a gift Jesus has instituted for our health and salvation. Through these streams of ministry, you and I have, really, unfettered access to the Lord's nourishment, healing and forgiveness.

May this weekend stir some renewed attentiveness to how we approach and celebrate these gifts, and treasure them for what they have been for 2000 years: the means by which Jesus continues to communicate Himself to us.

Next Saturday, our neighboring parish, St. Catherine of Siena, will celebrate their final weekend Mass. At the end of that day, St. Thomas More will take over responsibility for the campus, any lease or rental agreements in place, and ministry within those parish boundaries. While there have been many conversations and meetings regarding the logistics of this transition, the staffs at both parishes have been ably assisting me. That said, I do need your help with another piece.

For the remainder of the Easter Season, I am asking each of us to engage in the life of the Church in such a way that we own our responsibility to be the salt and light that helps illumine and preserve the faith of our neighbor. We can too easily excuse ourselves from the heavy lifting of exemplifying the best of the Church in our movements, trusting that another in the room will carry the day. We will have new faces in our assembly who will need our attentiveness.

This event gives all of us an opportunity to elevate the baseline of what we want our church experience to entail. I do not mean that just liturgically; I mean it communally. Christian life becomes "sticky" for the newcomer by the way they see Christians engage with one another. How we are together as the Body of Christ matters a whole lot in giving the Gospel some legs to reach the world. If you doubt, read through the Acts of the Apostles. The assembly matters. More details next week. For now, thanks for partnering with me on this ask, as we prepare to welcome some fellow pilgrims into our fold.



#### **Green Team Tip of the Week**

At a recent address at Gonzaga University, Cardinal Michael Czerny, the Pope's point man on climate change and head of the Vatican's Dicastery for the Promotion of Integral Human Development, agreed with the findings of the United Nations' Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change latest report:

"The perils facing nature and human society are now beyond debate," he said. "The problem today isn't ignorance but indifference and despair." But as Christians, the cardinal continued, we possess an "effective antidote to indifference and despair." That is, "to invest our time, talents and energy in compassion, solidarity, charity and the preferential option for the poor."
